#### RECOGNITION OF NEW MEMBERS AND CONGREGATIONS

#### REGISTRATION AND CREDENTIALS COMMITTEE

Dr. Nadasdy called on Rev. Tom Evans, chairman of the Registration and Credentials
Committee, to give an initial report. At the 77<sup>th</sup> Convention of the Minnesota South District there are a possible 365 voting delegates between lay and pastoral delegates. At this time 17

there are a possible 365 voting delegates between lay and pastoral delegates. At this time 171 pastoral delegates and 179 lay delegates have registered for a total of 350 voting delegates.

According to the bylaws, one-third of the delegates are needed for a quorum. The

requirements have been met for a quorum.

A motion was made and seconded to approve the report. The motion was carried by voice vote.

#### **DEVOTIONAL BIBLE STUDY 1**

Convention Chaplain Rev. Randall Neal led the convention in a liturgical opening devotion and led the first Devotional Bible Study "On Our Way Rejoicing" based on Acts 8:26-40. He talked about the "divine appointment" arranged for Philip the evangelist reported in Acts 8:26-27.

#### ESSAY 1

The Convention Essayist was Rev. Dr. Will Schumacher, Mission Associate Professor, Historical Theology, and Director, Institute for Mission Studies, Concordia Seminary, St. Louis. His theme was "The Joyful Way: Confessing and Witnessing the Good News of Jesus."

#### READING OF THE CONVENTION RULES

President Nadasdy introduced Ms. Darleen Harens, convention parliamentarian, who read the proposed revised convention rules.

The original Convention Rules were included in the *Convention Workbook* (pp. 34-35). The proposed revisions added point 14:

In balloting for all elected positions (including that of President and Vice Presidents), the convention will follow Synodical Handbook Bylaw 4.7.3, which reads:

- a) Candidates receiving a majority on the first ballot shall be declared elected.
- b) When a second or succeeding ballot is required for a majority, the candidate receiving the fewest votes and all candidates receiving less than 15 percent of the votes cast shall be dropped from the ballot, unless fewer than two candidates receive the 15 percent or more of the votes cast, in which case the three highest candidates shall constitute the ballot.
- c) In every election balloting shall continue until every position has been filled by majority vote.

As Rev. Dr. Dean Nadasdy addressed the convention, he announced that this will be his last term as District President. He sincerely hopes that the District may be as apolitical as possible. He thanked his wife Susie for her partnership and support during his time as District President. He talked about the preaching panel from Lucas Cranach's altarpiece in the Stadtkirche in Wittenberg, Germany. He noted the LCMS 500<sup>th</sup> Reformation celebration theme coming in 2017: "It's Still All About Jesus." In the scriptures we find that which binds us together and what we confess. Visitation is one thing that makes our church stronger. The "Preach the Word" initiative will receive much emphasis during the next triennium. Dr. Nadasdy wants to help shape a clear vision for Lutheran Education and schools in our district. He encouraged the convention to stand for the truth and boldly take the role of the servant. He will focus on church and school planting during the triennium. He outlined some of the issues coming before the convention and emphasized that we as a Church need to stand for Biblical truth with

the Gospel preeminent in the face of a culture that would go another direction.

He indicated these emphases during the new triennium: the "Koinonia Project;" the "Preach the Word" project; visitation; and the celebration of the 500<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Reformation.

#### **GREETINGS**

The convention received warm greetings from Rev. Don Fondow, the president of the Minnesota North District.

The convention also received greetings from the Rev. Dr. Tom Ries, President of Concordia University St. Paul. He explained that the academic theme for the coming school year will be "We Are God's Workmanship." He rejoiced that new faces are joining the department of Theology and Ministry. The Hoffman Institute has a new director with a professor of missiology, Rev. Mark Koschmann. He noted the blessings of the work of Rev. Tom Gundermann as University Pastor. Enrollment went over 4,000 students this year. This is the third year of the tuition reset. The University grew in enrollment enough to offset the lower tuition rate. Tuition for next year is just over \$20,000. Without this tuition reset, the annual tuition cost would have been \$30,000 or more. Special support is given to church work students. The Minnesota North District, Minnesota South District, and Concordia University, St. Paul will partner in a Reformation service on October 29, 2017, recognizing the 500<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Reformation.
