Student Financial Aid Policy

The following regulations govern the administration of the Minnesota South District Student Financial Aid Program.

- 1. The applicant shall be enrolled as a professional church worker student or be on the roster of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (graduate students). Undergraduate course work must be taken at a college or seminary operated by The Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod. Seminary students who are enrolled in residential or general SMP programs are eligible for the financial aid program administered under this policy; EIIT students and SMP Church Planters qualify for financial assistance under the Mission policies of the District.
- 2. The applicant shall be a communicant member of a congregation in the Minnesota South District.
- 3. Graduate students may be enrolled in a program outside of a college or seminary operated by The Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod. Programs must benefit the ministry of the LCMS and be approved by an MN South District staff member designated by the District President.
- 4. The amount of student aid to be provided will be determined on the basis of District policy and funds available.
 - a. Church-worker students enrolled in full-time programs qualify for one share.
 - b. SMP students enrolled full-time in a seminary program qualify for one share.
 - c. Residential seminary students qualify for two shares.
 - d. Part-time students must be enrolled a minimum of half-time. They receive $\frac{1}{2}$ share per application with a maximum of 4 shares.
- 5. Financial aid provided will be sent directly to the school and credited to the student's account during the current school year.
- 6. Students are expected to maintain a cumulative grade point average of at least 2.00.
- 7. Following graduation and initial placement, the worker is expected to serve in a full-time professional ministry at least one (1) year for each year of student aid provided.
- 8. Funds will be provided for a period of one (1) year only. If continuing aid is required, a new application must be submitted.
- 9. Students not recommended for seminary admission by the District's Pre-Seminary Interview Committee, but who are admitted to a seminary of the LCMS, are not eligible for financial aid.
